
Quick guide for students in Santiago

Before arriving to Chile

Weather: Santiago has a Mediterranean climate, with hot summers (around 30°C) and cold but dry winters (sometimes below 5°C). It doesn't rain often, but when it does, it can be surprising.

What to bring:

Warm clothing for winter (including a thick jacket and closed shoes)
Light clothing for summer
Power adapter type C or L (voltage 220V)
Sunscreen and sunglasses
From June to August, ski resorts are generally open





Arrival at the airport (Arturo Merino Benítez Airport)

These are the main options to get to the city:

TRANSPORT	COST	PROS	CONS
TRANSVIP	\$9.000 CLP	Safe, direct, shared with others	May take longer if there are many stops
TAXI OFICIAL	\$25.000 CLP o más	Comfortable, direct, no waiting	Expensive, especially during rush hours
BUS + METRO	\$2.500 CLP	Affordable, good option during daytime	More complicated if carrying a lot of luggage

Santiago Metro


It's the most efficient and safest way to get around. It connects much of the city and is widely used by students.

Fare: Between \$640 and \$800 CLP depending on the time of day

Bip! Card: You'll need a Bip! card, which can be purchased at metro stations for \$1,550 CLP and recharged based on your usage

Useful apps: Red Movilidad, Moovit, Bus Checker (to check real-time bus arrivals)

Santiago Metro Schedules and Fares

TIME SLOT	HOURS	FARE	OPERATION
Peak Hours	07:00 – 09:00 and 18:00 – 20:00	\$800 CLP	Some stations do not open: metro express system (see below)
Regular Hours	09:00 – 18:00	\$720 CLP	All stations open
Off-Peak Hours	06:00 - 07:00 and 20:00 - 23:00	\$640 CLP	All stations open

What is the Metro Express system?

During peak hours, some stations do not open their doors in order to optimize service speed and flow.

Trains are divided by color (Red and Green) and only stop at specific stations. Stations that serve both train types are called common stations.

This system operates on Line 2 and Line 5, from Monday to Friday.

SIM Card and Communication

To get a mobile line in Chile, you need your RUT (Rol Único Tributario). If you don't have a RUT yet, you can use a temporary eSIM like HolaFly or Airalo for the first few days. Many apps like WhatsApp will work normally.

Money and Shopping

Most places accept credit or debit cards. You can use apps like MercadoPago or MACH for local payments.

Withdrawing Money from ATMs

In Chile, if you are a foreigner and need to withdraw cash from an ATM, the best option is to use ATMs from Banco del Estado or Scotiabank. According to Wise, they are the only ones that don't charge additional fees for international cards. However, your home bank might charge a fee for the transaction, so check before traveling.

Useful Tips:

Redbanc: When using an ATM, select the option "Extranjeros / Foreign clients."

Withdrawal limit: Most ATMs in Chile allow withdrawals of up to \$200,000 CLP per transaction.

Currency exchange: You might be charged a fee for converting your currency to Chilean pesos.

Bank fees: Even if the ATM doesn't charge a fee, your bank may apply an additional charge.



Supermarkets

Líder (the cheapest)

Unimarc and other small local stores

At checkout, they may ask for your RUT; if you don't have one, you can say "no tengo" ("I don't have it") and there will be no problem.

Visa Registration in Chile

Who needs to do this?

All foreigners who obtain a stamped visa (temporary, subject to contract, student, etc.), whether inside or outside of Chile, must register it electronically on the website of the National Migration Service (SERMIG).

Steps:

- 1- Receive your approved visa by email.
- 2- Go to the website:
- https://tramites.serviciomigraciones.cl
- 3- Log in with your Clave Única (if you are in Chile) or your registered email address.
- 4- Fill out the visa registration form.

Attach:

- Copy of your passport
- Copy of your visa
- Previous ID document (if applicable)
- 5- Download the registration certificate once it's approved.
- Note: Visa registration used to be done in person at the International Police, but this changed: everything is digital since 2022.



Application for Identity Card for Foreigners (RUN)

Once your registration is approved, you can request your ID card at the Civil Registry.

Requirements:

Approved valid visa

Visa registration certificate issued by SERMIG

Passport

Contact phone number and email address

Steps:

Schedule your appointment online at: fr https://agenda.registrocivil.cl

Go to the nearest Civil Registry office with your documents.

They will take your photo and fingerprint.

You will receive your foreigner ID card (RUN) in approximately 1 to 3 weeks.

Important considerations: The ID card is mandatory for signing contracts, opening bank accounts, applying for jobs, among others. If your visa is still being processed (not yet approved), you must wait for approval before requesting your ID. The ID card will have the same validity period as the granted visa.
